Please note Hockey is played through Aria School and your teams will be organised by our coordinator Apolline Komene and payment will be made directly to Aria School.

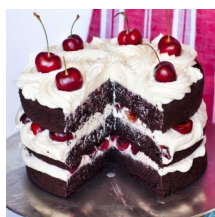

TE AO MĀORI PROGRAMME TERM 1

This term all the children have been studying the ten words at the centre of the understanding of Te Reo Māori. Until these words are understood it is more difficult to proceed to greater fluency with the language.

The following words are the basis of this;

tātou	All of us in the group.
mātou	All of us except person(s) outside our group being spoken to.
rātou	A group of more than two people outside our group being referred to.
tāua	You and I, inclusive.
māua	Myself and on other person referred to.
rāua	Two people referred to, exclusive.
koe	You, one person.
kōrua	You two people.
koutou	All of you, more than two.
ia	He or she, one person regardless of gender.

An easy way to remember the first six, is T M R, being the Maori Rule which should help.

2019 Maniapoto Māori Trust Board Primary, Secondary, and Tertiary Grants

Applications open Monday 18th February 2019 and close Friday 30th August 2019.

Are you or your children registered with the Maniapoto Māori Trust Board Tribal (MMTB) Register? If so, parents can make application on their children's behalf for the Primary School Grant.

If you have affiliations to Maniapoto iwi, but have not yet registered, you can download registration forms from the website www.maniapoto.iwi.nz. **You and your children must be registered to be eligible for this grant.** Forms can also be collected from the school office.

Payment of this grant will be made directly to your child's/children's nominated school account. **Payment will not be made to a personal bank account.**

It is highly recommended that parents/caregivers make contact with schools to discuss where you would like this grant to be used to benefit your child/ren.
