Welcome to Week 8

- ♦ **King Country Rugby - Development Officer Visit...** We are very fortunate to have been offered an hour session with each class on Tuesday 9th April starting at 9.00am.

In order for your children to take part they need a signed permission slip to be filled in and returned to school by that date. Unfortunately if the form isn't received by the 5th, your children cannot take part.

- ♦ **2019 Hell Pizza Reading Challenge...** We are again distributing pizza wheels to students who request them. When these wheels are signed by the teachers they can be exchanged for pizzas at any Hell Pizza outlet. To get these signed children need to meet certain criteria i.e. reading goals. Please ask your children or the staff for more information should you require it.
