Welcome to Week 9

Welcome to week 9 and our second to last newsletter for term 1.

- ♦ **Music Festival Update...** planning is well underway for the combined schools' Music Festival on Thursday September 19th 2019. All year 4-6 students will be taking part. Practices will begin here at school from about mid term 2.

All year 4-6 students were given the opportunity to audition for the Korimako choir, with Beth Dalton, our Musical Director. 11 of our students were successful, and shortly, a permission and information sheet will be sent home to inform families of what is involved. 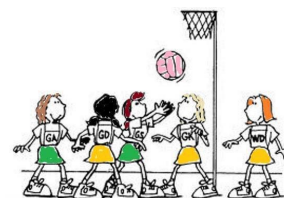

Mouthguards

Piopia Dental can make your own custom-made mouthguard!

Mouth Guard Options:

Child - \$60, Single layer 3.5-mm – Single layer offers greater protection than a much thinner boil and bite. The thinner layer is more comfortable for smaller mouths.

Intermediate - \$70, Double layer, 3.5-4mm – Two thin double layer adds more protection while still being thin enough for small mouths.

Adult - \$80, Double layer 5-6mm – Once all adult teeth are present, this is the recommended best option.

A double layer mouthguard offers more impact distribution. This means the energy from the impact is distributed through the mouthguard layers and less to the teeth and orofacial structures. Therefore, offering greater protection than the single layer mouthguard. Double layer is recommended for those in higher impact and higher-grade competitive sports.

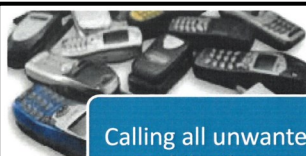
